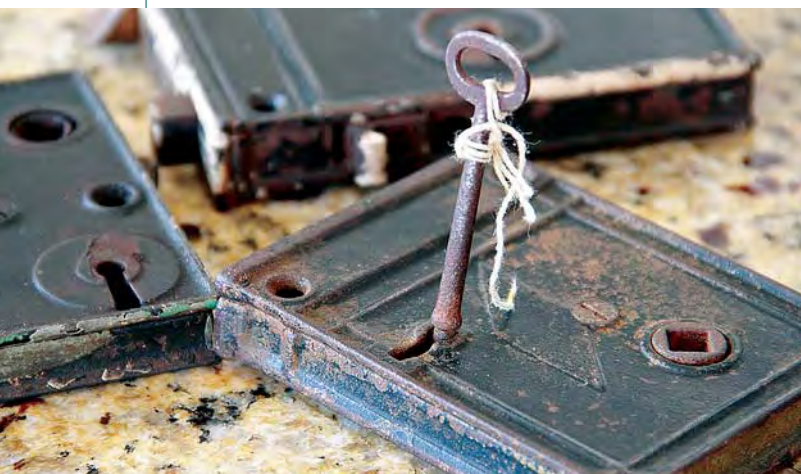


Antique Accents
